An objection that an official is married to a candidate or related to a candidate within two degrees of blood relations must be filed within 10 days of October 14th.

The total proposed school tax levy of 39.0 mills represents the same rate presently being levied.

Hillcrest School 35.9 Mill School Tax

The total proposed school tax levy of 38.2 mills includes 34.9 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation and 3.3 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by the debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes.

The total proposed school tax levy of 38.2 mills represents the same rate presently being collected.
